




## What is Streaming



#### How to Stream on your TV

- You MUST HAVE an Internet Connection!
- ▶ How big (Mbps) will depend on how many devices will be connected.
- Connect TV to the Internet
  - Any digital TV with laptop or tablet physically connected to the Internet
  - SMART TV with built in apps, these can be wired or Wi-Fi
  - Any digital TV with streaming device such as Roku, Amazon Fire, Chromecast, etc. These are wireless devices and require Wi-Fi setup in your home.
  - You may use a Blu-Ray player or console game system with internet connection.
- Some people are using only portable devices and are no longer buying televisions!




## Streaming Devices Smart TVs

- Access online content without a separate, streaming device
- Approximately 76% of TVs on the market today are Smart
- Limited content available, most only include Netflix, Hulu, Amazon and YouTube (subscriptions not included in cost of TV) but the list is growing.



## Streaming Services Monthly Subscriptions\*

- Acorn BBC lovers this option is only \$6.99/month or \$69.99/year.
- Netflix the first, and still most popular, service prices range from \$6.99 to \$19.99/month. Lots of popular original content. Watch on up to 4 screens at a time.
- Prime Video- part of your Amazon Prime subscription (\$139/year) or as stand alone service for \$8.99/month. Add-ons can include HBO Max (\$15.99/month), MGM+ (\$5.99/month), MLB.TV (\$24.99/month), Noggin (\$7.99/month), etc.

\*No Contract! If you don't like one, switch next month and try something new.






## Streaming Services Monthly Subscriptions\*

- Hulu \$7.99/month or \$79.99/month with commercials (or \$14.99 a month with no ads). \$69.99/month with live TV with commercials get Disney+ and EPSN+ (or \$82.99 a month with no ads).
- Sling TV between \$20 \$55/month depending on option (orange for 32 channels, blue for 40 channels, or orange and blue for \$55). Can only be used one device at a time, unless you pay extra.
- YouTube TV \$72.99/month Original YouTube content plus broadcast and cable channels, and all the Sports! Can do add-ons if you choose.



#### Streaming Services Monthly Subscriptions\*

- DirectTV Stream \$79.99/month for 75+ channels and on demand movies. \$109/month for 140+ channels (AT&T). Stream on unlimited devices.
- Fubo TV \$75/month for 173 channels of live TV with Cloud DVR and many options for sports lovers, \$84.99 for elite. Up to 10 screens at once.
- Philo \$25/month for cable TV channels, live or on-demand. Started in 2009 at Harvard University!
- Frndly TV-\$7-\$11 a month (basic to premiumpremium allows 4 screens at once, and DVRs saved up to 9 months).



#### Streaming Services The Networks

- Paramount+- \$6/month includes commercials, \$12/month commercial free. Watch all the top-rated shows (old & new) and new original programming including Twilight Zone, Yellowjackets, Your Honor, and Mayor Kingstown. Can also get it bundled with Showtime for \$119/year.
- Max \$9.99/month for movies and HBO originals (and Sesame Street!), \$15.99/month for no ads (both mentioned up to 2 screens). \$19.99/month up to 4 screens, ad-free.
- Starz (\$8.99/month, \$74.99/year), AMC+ (\$8.99/month, \$83.88/year), Peacock (NBC) (\$5.99/month with ads, \$11.99/month with no ads)









#### Streaming Services The Newbies

- Disney+ \$8/month regular, \$11/month premium (no ads). Disney's own content plus Star Wars, Marvel, Pixar and National Geographic. All Disney Channel movies and shows, and older sitcoms. Besides The Mandalorian, new Marvel shows are in the works.
- Apple TV+ \$6.99/month; 3 months included with purchase of a new Apple phone, tablet, laptop or TV (not smartwatch). Mostly original content from Oprah, Spielberg, JJ Abrams, Shyamalan. Ability to add premium channels at same cost.






#### Broadcast Options Number One Question - How can I watch local programming without cable or satellite?

- Keep basic cable (starting around \$20-25/month for 10+ channels)-also Xfinity Stream; Cox does a Starter package for \$25/month for 75 channels
- HD Antenna
- Streaming Services: most of these include some or all broadcast channels
  - Sling
  - YouTube TV
  - Hulu
  - Fubo
  - DirectTV Stream
  - Philo

## Broadcast Options Antennas

- Indoor Antennas can cost as little as \$20 or as much as \$70
- Can be installed easily, just like hanging a picture
- Experiment with placement for best reception
- Tvfool.com or AntennaWeb.org can give you the latest on which channels you can receive based on where you live
